



KIDS CLUB 2024: Frequently Asked Questions

What is it?

St Johns Maroubra Kids Club is a school holiday activity program for kids which runs each weekday morning (9am – 12noon) in the first week of the July school holidays. The mornings include activities, games, craft, bible stories and music and even a live action drama each day as our story unfolds.

At the end of the week the whole family is invited to come along to Super Sunday, an all-ages, kid-friendly and engaging church service that reveals the final chapter of the live action drama. The kids perform some special items they have prepared during the week. Following that, the fun continues with a family festival... jumping castle, face painting, BBQ lunch, craft and activities!

Where is it?

St Johns Maroubra, 339a Maroubra Road, Maroubra 2035

What ages can attend?

Preschool 3 years old (toilet trained) up to Year 6

What are the dates and times?

Monday 8th to Friday 12th July, 9am-12noon, just for kids

Plus! Super Sunday 14th July, 10am-12noon, for the whole family!

How much does it cost?

Day ticket = \$17, full week (Mon–Fri) = \$75, Super Sunday = FREE!

What is included in the cost?

Morning tea and all craft and activities.

What if I can't afford it?

Don't let the cost stop you from coming, email our office if you're interested in a subsidised ticket (office@stjohnsmaroubra.com).

How do I register my child to attend?

Register on our website as early as possible to avoid disappointment. We do allow limited registrations on the day but these are subject to availability.

What if my child has special needs?

We want our Kids Club to be accessible for all children. Please note any special needs or requirements for your child in your registration form or contact our office (office@stjohnsmaroubra.com) for more information.

What does a typical morning look like?

8:45-9am	Arrival and Parent/Guardian sign in
9-10am	All-together time – fun challenges, music and live action drama
10-11:45am	Group time – games and activities, craft, bible story and morning tea
11:45am-12noon	More all-together time
12noon	Parent/guardian sign out and departure

What does a typical morning tea look like?

A typical morning tea consists of fruit (eg oranges, bananas, mandarins, grapes, strawberries), home-made biscuits, slices, cake etc, hot food (different type each day eg chicken nuggets, spring rolls, pizza) and a drink of water.

What about allergies and dietary requirements?

Please note any allergies or special dietary requirements in your registration form.

We have a nut free policy, however some food may contain coconut. We do NOT offer gluten free alternatives although some of our food will be gluten free. We do NOT offer Vegan alternatives although some of our food will be meat free.

Why do I need to sign my child in and out?

We require an authorised parent/guardian to sign their child/children in and out as evidence of the transfer of care responsibilities.

What about health and safety?

Children are supervised at all times. All our team have current Working with Children Checks and meet the Safe Ministry requirements of the Anglican Church. Group meeting areas have undergone safety risk assessments. We encourage regular hand washing/sanitising for infection control.

What if my child is sick?

We ask that you assist by keeping your children home if they are experiencing any symptoms/sickness.

What about Refunds and Cancellations?

If you are unable to attend due to sickness / other misadventure please contact our office (office@stjohnsmaroubra.com) and request a refund.

We also understand that plans sometimes change. If you need to cancel your booking please contact our office (office@stjohnsmaroubra.com) and request a refund.

Refunds for cancellations which occur during the event may not be processed until after the event has concluded.
